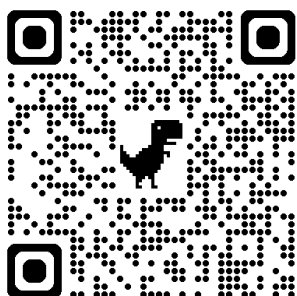
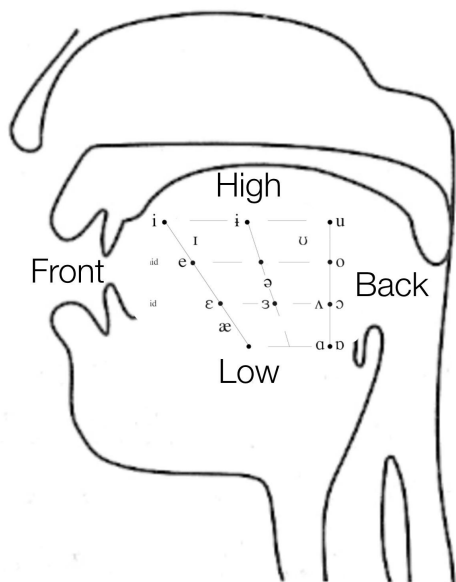
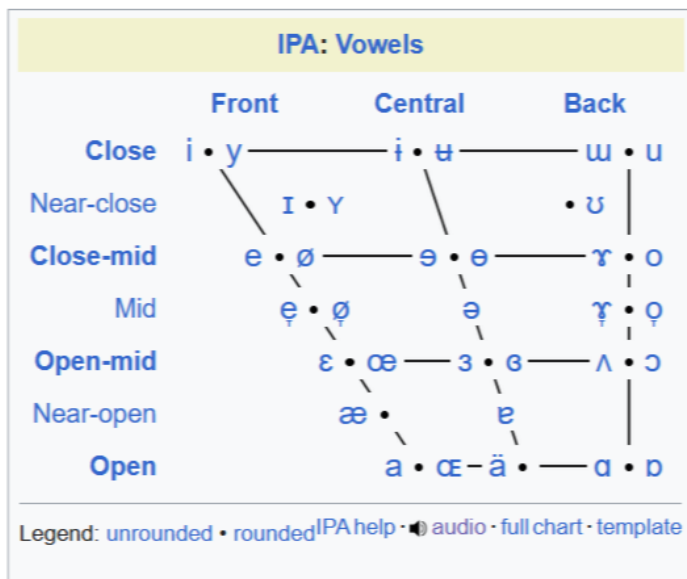

Welcome... Artificial-English™ is a new version of English language, it has no silent letters. It uses a combination of existing English letters and few phonemes from the International Phonetic Alphabet (I.P.A) .

The IPA is an alphabetic system of phonetic notation based primarily on the Latin script.
